### BAPTIZED WITH THE SPIRIT

In today's Gospel according to Luke, when John the Baptist clarified that he was not the expected Messiah, the Christ, he distinguished his baptism with water from the baptism "with the Holy Spirit and fire" that would be offered by Jesus. John's baptism with water signified the surrender of one's own agenda and the opening of one's heart to God. The baptism with fire and Spirit describes God's power entering and transforming the human heart. When Jesus was baptized in water, he publicly displayed his own full commitment to following God's path for him. When the Spirit descended upon Jesus, he was empowered to begin his work. In effect, Jesus received both kinds of baptism described by John. He would go on to "baptize" those whose hearts were open through his ministry, death, and resurrection. Later, at Pentecost, the new community received a "baptism" of Spirit with tongues of fire.

### BAUTIZADOS CON EL ESPÍRITU

En el Evangelio de Lucas de hoy, cuando Juan el Bautista aclara que él no es el esperado Mesías, el Cristo, él distingue su bautismo con agua del bautismo con el Espíritu Santo y fuego que Jesús va a ofrecer. El bautismo de Juan con agua significa la renuncia a nuestros propios intereses y la apertura de nuestro corazón a Dios. El bautismo con fuego y Espíritu describe al poder de Dios entrando y transformando el corazón humano. Cuando Jesús fue bautizado con agua, él públicamente manifestó su compromiso total a seguir el camino de Dios para él. Cuando el Espíritu desciende sobre Jesús, él fue fortalecido para empezar su ministerio. En efecto, Jesús recibió ambos tipos de bautismo descritos por Juan. Él iría a bautizar a aquellas personas cuyo corazón estuvieron abiertos durante su ministerio, muerte y resurrección. Después, en Pentecostés, la nueva comunidad recibió un bautismo de Espíritu con lenguas de fuego.

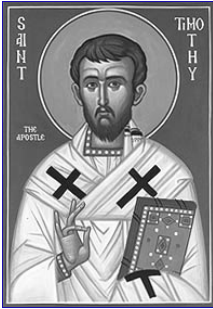

## Solemnity of St. Timothy – January 27, 2019

### BIOGRAPHY

Born at Lystra, Lycaenia, Timothy was the son of a Greek father and Eunice, a converted Jewess. He joined St. Paul when Paul preached at Lystra replacing Barnabas, and became Paul's close friend and confidant. Paul allowed him to be circumcised to placate the Jews, since he was the son of a Jewess, and he then accompanied Paul on his second missionary journey. When Paul was forced to flee Berea because of the enmity of the Jews there, Timothy remained, but after a time was sent to Thessalonica to report on the condition of the Christians there and to encourage them under persecution, a report that led to Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians when he joined Timothy at Corinth. Timothy and Erastus were sent to Macedonia in 58, went to Corinth to remind the Corinthians of Paul's teaching, and then accompanied Paul into Macedonia and Achaia. Timothy was probably with Paul when the Apostle was imprisoned at Caesarea and then Rome, and was himself imprisoned but then freed. According to tradition, he went to Ephesus, became its first bishop, and was stoned to death there when he opposed the pagan festival of Katagogian in honor of Diana. Paul wrote two letters to Timothy, one written about 65 from Macedonia and the second from Rome while he was in prison awaiting execution.

While his feast day in the liturgical calendar is January 26, our parish has moved it on the closest **Sunday, January 27**, and has proclaimed it as a **Solemnity**. The Novena in his honor begins on the 18th and ends on the 26th. The theme of our celebration is "One Family loving and serving the Lord".

### Prayer for the Solemnity of our Patron St. Timothy

*Dear God, we praise you and thank you  
for the diversity of gifts and graces  
within our faith community of St. Timothy.  
You have blessed us with a beautiful variety of people,  
personalities, interests, and cultures.  
Help us O God to act as one united family

During our celebrations,  
may we see the image of our patron saint  
as a perfect example for all of us to follow in our daily life.  
As he came from diverse cultures  
and lived his life carrying out the mission of his baptism  
– acting as priest, prophet, and king, help us to  
imitate him with love for Your glory.  
We ask this through Christ our Lord.  
Amen.*

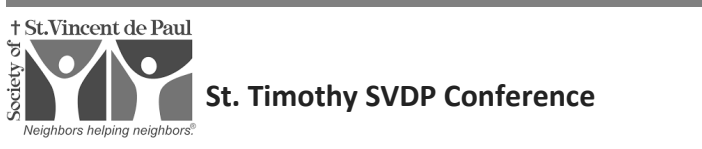
