RADICAL LOVE

Have you ever read or heard anything about Jesus being called a “radical”? What such a statement ignores is that God has been a radical all through salvation history. What kind of superior being forgives the kind of unloving actions humankind has committed through the centuries? Answer: a God of radical mercy, kindness, love. In today’s Gospel, Jesus teaches that, like himself, like God, we must love with God-like radical compassion, even those who are our “enemies.” Didn’t Jesus give us an extreme example, forgiving those who put him to death? How difficult it is to be like God, like Jesus, forgiving, even *loving*, the very people who have treated us badly!

The first reading gives another example. David was under a death sentence by King Saul, who had become David’s enemy through jealousy. Given an opportunity to murder Saul in his sleep, David chose to let him live, out of respect for God’s will toward Saul. David recognized that the only way for him to do God’s will was to love Saul, his enemy, enough to refrain from being judge, jury, and executioner.

AMOR RADICAL

¿Te ha tocado oír o leer algo acerca de que Jesús era llamado radical? Lo que esa afirmación ignora es que Dios ha sido un radical a través de toda la historia de la salvación. ¿Qué tipo de ser superior perdona el tipo de actos no cariñosos que la humanidad ha hecho a lo largo de los siglos? Respuesta: un Dios de una misericordia radical, bondadosa y de amor. En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús enseña que, como él mismo, como Dios, nosotros debemos amar con una compasión radical como la de Dios, incluso con aquellos enemigos nuestros. ¿Acaso Jesús no nos dio un ejemplo extremo, perdonando a quienes lo mataron? ¡Qué tan difícil es ser como Dios, como Jesús, perdonando, incluso amando, a las mismas personas que nos tratan mal!

La primera lectura nos da otro ejemplo. David estaba sentenciado a muerte por el Rey Saúl, quien por envidia se había convertido en enemigo de David. Teniendo la oportunidad de asesinar a Saúl mientras dormía, David eligió dejarlo con vida, por respeto a la voluntad de Dios hacia Saúl. David reconoció que la única manera para él para hacer la voluntad de Dios era amar a Saúl, su enemigo, suficiente para abstenerse de ser juez, jurado y verdugo.

Reconciliation and Lent

Lent is a wonderful time to celebrate the reconciling love and the healing grace our Lord offers us. Like all religious experience, Lent takes preparation.

Preparing

Reconciliation is what God does. We prepare for it by opening ourselves up, by reflecting on the areas of darkness in our lives into which God so deeply desires to shine a light. It might begin with a simple question: Where might God be offering me forgiveness and healing? If my answer is, "I don't know," then I have some reflecting to do. I can examine my life-what I have done and what I have failed to do-and see what graces are offered me there.

Coming to genuine sorrow for our sins is difficult. We might think that anything that makes us feel bad about ourselves is something to be avoided at all costs. If we avoid guilty feelings, we ask God to rouse in us a sense of embarrassment, leading to deep sorrow, about any way that we may not have been faithful, honest, loving, selfless, or generous. We can look at our responsibilities as neighbors, employees, members of a parish or congregation, parents, spouses, sons, or daughters. We might be intimidated by the size of the problem that comes to mind when we ask where God might be offering us forgiveness and healing. It might be a pattern of bad behavior toward our spouses and family. It might be our vices. I might say, "I feel sorry for how I treat my spouse or my children." We may feel remorse for all the good intentions that never make their way into action. It is important not to stop there. No problem we have sums up all of who we are before God and others. The issues that come to mind might yield clues about some larger patterns. For example, I see that I tend to be loose with the truth at times. What does this reveal about me? I may discover that the real pattern of sin has to do with a deeper dishonesty or lack of integrity: hiding from God, leading a double life, not being who I really am called to be, trying to manage my life on my own terms, manipulating others for my own needs and desires. When the light of God's love shines into this level of self-awareness, I am touched by a powerful experience of reconciliation. Even here, in a place I might be most embarrassed and feel most naked, God is loving me and offering me wholeness and joy.
