

A Message from our Administrator...

The San Francisco Bay Area will continue to shelter in place through the end of May. COVID-19 has forced us, church leaders to ask questions like, "How can we remain faithful to pastor our people especially when we can't gather together? In the Gospel from John, Jesus compares his followers to sheep and himself to a gate that protects them. The physical gate of our lives may stay closed but Jesus said, "I am the gate." He is the gate that opens and leads to the pastures of abundant life and he is the gate that stands against death. We open or close in collaboration with Jesus. "The sheep follow [the shepherd] because they know his voice."

Who or what stands at your gates today? Who or what are the people, opportunities, possibilities, and choices that seek entry into your life? The gates in our life are threshold places, times of discernment, moments of transition, and decisions to be made. To whom or what do you need to open and to whom or what do you need to close? How might your life change if you open? What might you miss if you close? Will your life be enhanced and empowered by opening or will something be lost? What pain or wound might you prevent by closing? Where is fear in all this? Which will enhance and add to life today, opening or closing?

We are the gatekeeper and guardian of our heart. Guarding our heart means staying awake, being watchful, and remaining diligent. Awareness of what is happening

within and outside us are the gatekeeper's key. Depending on who or what it is we either open our heart or keep it closed. Sometimes we need to open the gate and sometimes we need to keep the gate of our life closed. Look back on your life and you can see that.



With the extended shelter-in-place order, this will not be possible. We are discussing a new common date for initiations. We will let you know what is decided.

CONFIRMATIONS

All Confirmations in May and June have been cancelled.

ADULT CONFIRMATIONS

The adult Confirmations normally held on Pentecost Sunday at the Cathedral have been cancelled. We are looking for a new date at the cathedral and will let you know as soon as we find it.

FIRST COMMUNIONS

Many parishes are asking about First Communions scheduled this Spring. Obviously, until we can gather for Mass again, this will not be possible.

Free Online Class on Women and the Catholic Mystical Tradition from SF Archdiocese School of Pastoral Leadership on May 12th

With all this time being cooped up at home, wouldn't it be great if you could virtually invite a professor from our very own St. Patrick's Seminary into your home to give a college-level course on mystical theology? Wouldn't it be even better if you didn't have to be too concerned about grades or expensive enrollment fees? In anticipation of the grand re-opening of the Archdiocesan School of Pastoral Leadership this Fall, and in response to the shelter-in-place orders in California, we're excited to announce a live online course titled "Women and the Mystical Tradition of the Church" which will be taught by the very renowned Dr. Anthony Lilles from St. Patrick's Seminary and BeginningToPray.com.

The course will unfold chief characteristics of mystical wisdom including the mystery of the Church, love of the truth, devotion to Christ, contemplative prayer, Divine Mercy, and the Indwelling of the Trinity. Dr. Lilles will guide students through the lives and teachings of illustrious saints such as St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Catherine of Sienna, St. Hildegard of Bingen, and others.

This eight-week course will include weekly live thirty minute lectures on the mystic's life, approach to spirituality, and an important doctrinal theme followed by a twenty minute question and answer period. The instruction intends to be mystagogical rather than simply informational, offering those fully initiated into the Catholic Church the opportunity to deepen their encounter with Christ and receive anew His transforming love.

You'll need to act quickly. The first class is free and takes place on May 12th. Pre-registration is required. The first class is free with no commitment to sign up for the whole eight-week course. The full eight-week course, valued at hundreds of dollars, is available for only \$20. All lectures will be archived for later viewing for all who enroll in the full course.
