

TODAY'S READINGS First Reading — Filled with the Holy Spirit, the apostles begin to speak in tongues (Acts 2:1-11)

Psalm — Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth *(Psalm 104)*

Second Reading — In one Spirit we are baptized into one body and given to drink of one Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13)

Gospel — Jesus Christ appears to the disciples and sends them on their mission with the power to forgive or retain sins through the Holy Spirit (*John 20:19-23*)

Jesus prays for us.

This 7th Week of Easter, we read about Jesus is praying to the Father. The whole Chapter 17 of John's Gospel. Jesus prays for us. It's comforting to know in this time that we are in the midst of discerning about an important part of our Faith Life; that is our gathering as community of prayer. Jesus prays for us. Three times he asks our Father that we would all become one as he and the Father are one. Jesus prays that we would be one as he and the Father are one so that our oneness would be the manifestation of God's presence to the world. Oneness in the midst of difference becomes a sacramental presence of God's life in the world.

Jesus and the Father are one because they love and give themselves to each other. Oneness is a quality of life – God's life. Jesus' prayer for oneness is ultimately that we would be and live like God.

Oneness is not about eliminating differences. It is about love. Love is the only thing that can ever overcomes division.

If Jesus is praying for our oneness then he is also recognizing and rejecting the boundaries and differences that divide us. There are divisions within ourselves, our families, our churches, our nation. We live in a world full of divisions – based on gender, economic conditions, religion, race, language and politics, education....! These divisions exist not only


BAPTISM: The Sacrament of Baptism is limited to those with an urgent pastoral need.
